FORCE COMMANDER IN FINLAND

LIEUTENANT - GENERAL A.E. MARTOLA, COMMANDER OF THE UNITED NATIONS FORCE IN CYPRUS, left Nicosia on Wednesday, 2 August 1967, for a brief private visit to Finland.

During his stay in Finland, General Martola, who is also President of the Finnish Red Cross, will participate in the Conference of the Presidents of the Scandinavian Red Cross Societies which will take place in Helsinki between 4 and 8 August.

The Commander will return to Nicosia on 15 August 1967. During his absence, Brigadier M.N. Harbottle, O.B.E., Chief of Staff, will be officiating Commander of the Force.

MORE U.N. OBSERVERS IN SUEZ

SIX OBSERVERS FROM FRANCE ARRIVED LAST WEEK IN THE SUEZ CANAL AREA TO JOIN THE UN OBSERVATION TEAM WHICH IS CHECKING COMPLIANCE WITH THE ISRAEL-UAR CEASE-FIRE. Three of them will be based in Kantara, on the east bank of the Canal, and the other three will be stationed in Ismailia on the west bank, bringing the strength of the UN observer groups up to a total of 16 on each side of the Canal.

Observers have been conducting patrols on both sides. The situation in general remained quiet, both in the Suez sector and the Israel-Syria sector. Press reports told, however, of the exchange of fire across the Jordan river, where there are no UN observers. Jordan and Israel accused each other of the responsibility for starting the shooting.

VARIETY THE SPICE OF LIFE

mets. The colourful uniforms made a pleasing contrast against the olive green of the Swedish contingent and the khaki of the guard element of the Dukes.


Within a short time the sound of martial music had drawn a crowd of spectators of many nationalities, many of whom, by a strange coincidence, had their cameras with them.

FORCE COMMANDER

PRESENTS UN MEDALS TO IRCON

A Guard of Honour with Colour Party and Pipe band rendered honours.









KYRENIA STAMPEDE

IT WAS THE CALGARY STAMPEDE ALL OVER AGAIN, COMPLETE WITH COWBOYS in white stetson's, beauty queen contest, bucking bronc, Chuckwagon race and a barbecue.

There were some differences of course, the cowboys and the beauty queen contestants were soldiers, men of the Second Battalion of the Queen's Own Rifles of Canada. The Chuckwagons were jeep trailers, pulled by hot, sweating, teams of soldiers and the bucking bronc was a barrel, suspended by four ropes.

The Second Battalion, when in Canada, is based at Calgary Alberta, which is world famous for it's Calgary Stampede. The Stampede is held every summer for seven to ten days and cowboys and aspiring cowboys

from all over North America compete for substantial cash prizes by riding, roping, throwing and getting trampled by various types of livestock, so perhaps it was only natural that when Calgary Day Plans were made, they should include a western flavour.

There were other activities, a greasy pole climbing contest, tug-of-war, greased pig, and volley ball. Winners of all the competitions were awarded white cowboy hats.

Although the Mayor of Calgary, Jack Leslie, was unable to attend the celebrations, the City of Calgary contributed nearly 900 T-bone and sirloin steaks which were barbecued over out-door grills. These, along with corn-on-the-cob and baked potatoes provided the main course for the excellent meal that rounded out the day.

U THANT URGES EAST - WEST DETENTE

LAST WEEK, SECRETARY-GENERAL U THANT, SPOKE OF THE REPERCUSSIONS of the Vietnam war on other situations of crisis and also stressed the element of human suffering in the Middle East situation which, he said, remained ominous.

He spoke in this connection of the long-standing problem of Palestine refugees which had become much graver as a result of the recent military conflict. "I believe, he said, both in Vietnam and in the Middle East, there will be no solution to the problem if the human factor is ignored".


He said, and he emphasized, the need for making a fresh search for peace in the Middle East so that the rights of all countries in the area might be respected.

U Thant felt that if the Vietnam and the Middle East conflicts could be resolved, there might be a resumption of detente between the East and the West which had been developing until the recent escalation of the Vietnam war. Detente between the two superpowers, he said, was an indispensable first step towards the bringing about of peaceful conditions over the rest of the world.

APARTHEID

U. N. SEMINAR CONDEMNS RACIST POLICIES IN AFRICA

THE UNITED NATIONS SEMINAR ON APARTHEID, RACIAL DISCRIMINATION AND COLONIALISM HAS AFFIRMED that an effective international action is imperative if racial tensions are not to transform the southern part of Africa into a cockpit of bloodshed, with incalculable consequences for international peace and security.

In the declaration adopted at its meeting in Kitwe, Zambia, the seminar stated that the forces of apartheid were engaged in a deliberate attempt at undermining the lawful governments in independent Africa, with the "oppressive regime of South Africa playing the primary role in this nefarious activity".

Condemning racist and colonial regimes in Southern Africa, the declaration asserted that the crushing of the illegal racist minority regime in southern Rhodesia was the immediate priority for world community. It expressed the conviction, however, that even the achievement of this immediate objective could not be ensured so long as the South African regime felt itself immune from effective international pressure.

UN ADEN MISSION TO GENEVA

THE UN SPECIAL MISSION ON ADEN PLANS TO LEAVE NEW YORK ON AUGUST 10TH FOR A SERIES OF MEETINGS IN GENEVA. While in New York, the Mission has held meetings with the delegation of "Front for the liberation of occupied south Yemen", (FLOSY) and has also had conversations with Sir Humphrey Trevelyan, British Commissioner in Aden.

The Mission, consisting of ambassadors of Venezuela, Afghanistan and Mali had been sent last spring to the British controlled territories in the southern part of the Arabian peninsula to find out how the UN could help prepare and oversee the free elections leading to independence, which Britain has scheduled for next year. However, the UN panel left Aden after only five days, declaring that the local British authorities were not cooperating. The charge was denied by Britain. The Mission returned to New York on April 18th following talks with British officials in London.

re, and so long as Portugal could count on the unwillingness of its military allies to join in such a pressure against it.

The declaration recognized that various resolutions adopted in the past by the General Assembly and the Security Council provided an adequate framework for international action, but it deplored what it described as the unwillingness of South Africa's and Portugal's major trading partners, including the three permanent members of the Security Council, to cooperate fully in giving effect to the UN's decisions.

The declaration stated that the seminar attached great importance to persuading those states mainly responsible for preventing the international action to change their attitudes. To this end, it urged active efforts to mobilize world opinion, and especially public opinion within countries unwilling to lend full support to UN policies in favour of effective action against apartheid, racial discrimination and colonialism in southern Africa. The declaration was adopted without formal note.
