BACKGROUND/ OBJECTIVES:	<p>The Joint Analysis and Reporting Unit (JARU) of UNSMIL supports the mission leadership's decision-making through integrated analysis and predictive assessments and identifies threats to mandate implementation. The JARU reports to the Chief of Staff.</p> <p>Under the overall supervision of the Senior Information Analyst (JARU) the Consultant will conduct a mapping of the Libyan open source landscape (with a specific focus on social media), develop a social media monitoring plan with a focus on strategic and operational developments in the country, and monitor and assess trends, dynamics and sentiments through open source analysis.</p>
DESCRIPTION OF DUTIES:	<p>The Consultant will provide JARU with dedicated open source analytical expertise and help develop its social media monitoring capacity, include sentiment analysis and social network analysis. The Consultant will map relevant media and social media outlets and develop a social media monitoring plan with an implementation mechanism. The Consultant will also monitor and assess trends and dynamics in Libya through social media, with view to identifying threats to mandate implementation, and contribute to the development of JARU products.</p> <p>The Consultant will be required to travel to Libya to perform part of his/her tasks. This includes meetings with mission counterparts in-country and Libyan representatives (such as research centers and</p>



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	NGOs). The destination of her/his travel will be locations for which UN security assessments will have been undertaken.
DELIVERABLES:	The Consultant is required to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a) Conduct a mapping of Libyan open sources, with a special focus on social media outlets; b) Develop a social media monitoring plan with an implementation mechanism (including sentiment and social network analysis); c) Conduct social media-based open sources monitoring and analysis and contribute to drafting regular JARH products, including visualization of information.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:	<p>Education Advanced university degree (Master's degree or equivalent) in political sciences, international relations, social science, journalism, anthropology or a related area. A first-level university degree in combination with two additional years of qualifying experience may be accepted in lieu of the advanced university degree.</p> <p>Work/Research Experience A minimum of five years of progressively responsible experience in political affairs, information analysis, military affairs, humanitarian affairs or a related field. Proven experience in drafting high-quality, accurate documents in English is required. Experience in open sources analysis and working with social media platforms is required. Previous working experience in multicultural and multidisciplinary teams is required. Professional experience in North Africa is desirable.</p>
